Again this month I am delighted to report that significant progress is being made on our commitments to enhancement, improve and protect local services in Braunstone Town as follows:

Library: the County Council's Cabinet on 9th March approved the Town Council's outline proposals to take over management of the Library service, while the County Council continues to meet its long-term lease obligations. This is good news for Braunstone Town since this decision at last secures the future of our library after years of uncertainty. Transfer however will not take place until later in the year as the legal agreements and detailed arrangements needed to ensure that the transfer is successful needs to be undertaken. I know the future of our Library is important to many residents and I will keep you updated with progress.

Shakespeare Park: we have received and are assessing tenders for the construction works of the pavilion and redesign of the site. In addition to our own funds, we are seeking Sport England funding and external sponsorship towards this project which will greatly improve the sporting provision as well as the playground and tennis courts provision.

Thorpe Astley Medical Rooms: last month I reported that building works had been commissioned to make alterations to the facilities at Thorpe Astley Community Centre, in order for a GP service to operate from the Centre. These works are now complete and the treatment rooms have been formally handed over to the NHS to complete final preparations ahead of opening to patients. Further updates concerning the services to be provided from the Centre and confirmation of an opening date is expected to be issued by the Clinical Commissioning Group and the Surgery this month. Information will also be published by the Town Council on our website and on our social media accounts and notice boards.

GRANTS FOR COMMUNITY GROUPS

Braunstone Town Council makes small grants available to community organisations, individuals and youth activities to assist their work.

Community Grants may be used to pay for equipment, transport costs, hire of rooms, guest speakers, training etc. up to £300 per project per year.

Individual Braunstone Town residents can apply for a grant up to £300 to support residents with an outstanding skill, for developing skills and allowing them to take up an opportunity they would not otherwise be able to take.

The Youth Grant is available for youth projects where young people are involved in the decision making process and must directly benefit young in areas of art, sport, improvement to health or the environment. £1,200 is available per year.

The Town Council can also advise on funding from other sources and will encourage and assist community groups in making applications from other sources.
