### Highway Issues - Thorpe Astley

Following a meeting in June concerning highways issues in Thorpe Astley, the following progress has been made:

\* Leicestershire County Council have commissioned surveys which once completed and analysed will enable them to propose solutions to address the concerns raised in relation to traffic,

safety and parking. We will keep residents informed of progress.

- \* the Local Police Beat Team are keeping a regular eye on parking in Thorpe Astley, particularly from Meridian. They have been working with local businesses and where necessary have placed advisory notices for dangerous/obstructive parking on vehicles.
- Concerning speeding, thank you to all residents who signed the pledge of support for a Community Speedwatch scheme, we have 211 valid signatures which is enough and

therefore we have made an application to establish Community Speedwatch in Thorpe Astley. We will keep residents informed of progress and advise on how you can get involved.

## Your car:

- \* When shopping for gifts, keep them out of sight if they can be seen they can be stolen;
- \* Never leave keys in the ignition even for a short period;
- \* Always close windows, engage steering lock and lock all doors;
- \* Take all valuables (purses, wallets and satnav) with you;
- \* Park your car in a well-lit area or in an attended car park.

#### Your house:

- Ensure all doors and windows are locked;
- \* Presents should be kept out of view;
- Never leave car keys or handbags downstairs or near the front door:
- \* Going on holiday? Consider using automatic lights, cancel milk and papers and ask neighbor to keep an eye on your house and put your bins in and out;
- \* Only open the door after you have identified the caller and sure who they are;
- \* Do not keep large amounts of cash at home use a bank/building society.
