As Town Mayor I am delighted to send Christmas greetings to all residents for 2018. It continues to be a pleasure to meet so many local residents at a wide variety of events organised by our local groups and organisations who are at the heart of our community. Events have ranged from community fetes and open days, through cultural events and commemoration concerts to a children's disco.

The significant event this year was the commemorations of the 100th anniversary of the end of the Great War/World War 1. If like me you attended the Remembrance Sunday Service and Parade or if you have passed by the Civic Centre, you will have been moved by the 14,178 hand-made unique poppies each commemorating the life of a Leicestershire man lost during service in World War One. My thanks go to the hard work and dedication of the volunteers from Braunstone Community Life who joined together to create the

Poppy Cascade. We don't know the amount of time it took to create the hand-crafted poppies but the team spent well over 2,500 hours sewing the poppies onto the meshes, which is approximately 55 square metres.

The Group also had the vision to refurbish the memorial garden with the two memorial stones. The garden and memorial garden will provide a focal point in the years to come for acts of remembrance and dedication to our service personnel through Armed Forces Day and other events.

Both Harvest Community Church and Ratby Co-operative Mid Band will be hosting Christmas events at the Civic Centre this month (details below) and the Town Mayor's Carol Service is at St Crispin's Church on 16th December at 6.30pm, with donations to my chosen charity for the year RSPB Leicestershire Branch, Woodside Animal Centre. All are welcome.

- * Going on holiday? Consider using automatic lights, cancel milk and papers and ask a neighbour to keep an eye on your house and put your bins in and out;
- * Only open the door after you have identified the caller and sure who they are;
- Do not keep large amounts of cash at home use a bank/building society.
