I would like to extend our appreciation to all those local residents and partners who have, over the year, become involved in events and projects instigated by the Council and given their support to assist us in providing the high level of service to local people.

FUTURE OF BRAUNSTONE TOWN LIBRARY IN DOUBT



Following the County Council's decision to hand over Libraries to be run by communities or face closure and a consultation meeting held in June 2014, residents have expressed concerns about the important

role the Library plays in the community for reading, learning and social inclusion and that with the best will in the world, such a service would be difficult to retain solely dependent upon volunteers. Equally Town residents have expressed a clear view that they should not have to pay again for this service while still paying for County Library Services elsewhere.

Over the last 10 months the Town Council, listening to these concerns and recognising increasing social change in our community along with the pressures of funding on public services, developed detailed and ambitious proposals, in consultation with the Town's Citizens' Advisory Panel, to meet local needs by combining the Council's Customer Service Shop with the Library. These proposals represent to both the County and District Councils a revenue saving over 50%, while increasing opening hours and providing for further social inclusion activities to be based in the facility. Despite our proposals providing these efficiency savings by recycling funds which the County Council is already committed to under a 99 year lease agreement on the premises, thereby avoiding double-taxation while retaining professional staffing, the County Council's Cabinet on 16th June looks set to receive a recommendation from County Officers to reject our proposals.

Leader of the council Cllr.Nick Brown said *"Before making any hasty decisions that would threaten library services across Braunstone Town & Thorpe Astley, we would ask the County Council cabinet members to look at the detail of our proposals. We do not believe these have been given serious consideration by the council's officers who have limited themselves to a one-size-fits-all approach. I would have thought our proposals were exactly to sort of imaginative and innovative idea that a forward looking council would jump on. It would be foolish if these were rejected out of hand without further discussions, especially as there are real cash savings for all the councils involved."*

This looks like being a major setback for the Town Council and puts the future of the Library Service in doubt. The Town Council will be looking at its options at Policy and Resources Committee on 11th June and we will keep residents informed via our website at:
