*At the beginning of this financial year I highlighted that Blaby District Council had voted to end the payment to parish and town councils of the parish share of Council Tax Support Grant and New Homes Bonus from next April (2018), in order to plug a gap in their own finances. The loss of this income, along with existing financial pressures faced by the Town Council equates to an approximate increase of 17% on the Town Council's share of Council Tax bills. For a typical household in a Band B property this would mean paying around £15 per year extra.*

*The Town Council's Policy & Resources Committee on 26<sup>th</sup> October identified both the pressures on our expenditure and the cuts to our income. Between November and January we will be reviewing the services we provide and the balance between making savings and increasing Council Tax. I cannot underestimate the difficulty of this task for the Town Council, ultimately the cut imposed by Blaby District Council puts our services at risk while placing a greater burden of cost on our community, which could lead to even higher taxes or bigger cuts in the long term.*
